• Embargo-an official ban on trade with a particular country. The oil embargo mentioned in the episode was declared in October of 1973 by OPEC, an alliance of oil-producing countries, to punish the United States and other countries that supported in Israel in the Yom Kippur War against Egypt, Syria, and Jordan. As a result of the 6-month embargo, gas prices soared, long lines at gas pumps became commonplace, and the United States economy was plunged into recession.

"We will have to explain to our children why they will not receive toys," one speaker said.

"We will tell them that not getting presents may seem terrible, but that later in life, they will discover that the power structure is denying them things much more important than toys.

"They might as well learn now to be prepared for deprivation of their very birthrights. We are all being deprived of our rights to jobs and education, and our cultural heritage," he said.

It was decided that "the bare necessities of life" could be purchased at out-of-town stores, but that no "major purchases" would be made until Rizzo is fired.
